See you at our January meeting with our very own member Ron Wright who will be our guest speaker.



A Certain Justice by P.D. James (Phyllis Dorothy) – Inspector Adam Dalglies Mystery Book 10, but utterly readable by itself. The three people who read this one, were very impressed with the writing style and structure; the scene was beautifully set for the murder motive and the character descriptions were interesting. A good tip if reading this on your kindle is to write down the names of the characters, as backtracking is not as easy as with a paper version.

We gave it a 3, a 4 and another 4 out of 5 as an indication for those still wanting to read it

**Crows Nest** by Nikki Mottram – Dana Gibson Mysteries Book 1 (with a second book out soon, if not already: Killarney).

This one rated a 4 by the two people who have read it while the two still reading it considered it good so far but preferred no spoilers. Suffice to say it is interesting, set in Toowoomba and Sydney and not available at Darwin Library but they ordered it in from elsewhere.

Wild Swans - three daughters of China by Jung Chang The three people who read it gave this one a 5 out of 5. A true history, very informative, starting with the eldest daughter during Mao Tse Tung's period and ending with the youngest of the three daughters during the Cultural Revolution. The three who haven't are determined to read it over the festive season, particularly since the next book club meeting is not until the first Monday in February '24.


