

G'day. My name is Arthur Ritis. If you'll allow me I will bring you tips now and then on literature and film I've enjoyed recently.

Let's start with a book. Old Arthur has tended to be hooked on the crime fiction genre for some years. But thanks to eavesdropping on Bev Barnes's book club, he has discovered a wealth of new authors and topics. Here in the Top End, we are blessed with great public libraries, and you will find most if not all of the titles suggested in the Darwin and Palmerston City Libraries.



"Lessons in Chemistry"

Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel–prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all

things-her mind.

True chemistry results. But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking ("combine one tablespoon acetic acid with a pinch of sodium chloride") proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. Because as it turns out, Elizabeth Zott isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo.

Laugh-out-loud funny, shrewdly observant, quirky, poignant and studded with a dazzling cast of supporting characters, Lessons in Chemistry is as original and vibrant as its protagonist. Highly recommended; a great read.

And a screen view. So much to choose from !!!

Why not read the above book then check out the mini-series. Starring Academy Award winning actress Brie Larson, the show is now running on Apple TV. Arthur loves doing that. 




