


Enjoying Probus Day morning tea at Pearl Leisure Centre





We met at the Cas Club as usual. Our 7-minute write-up was on the topic "A gust of wind".



GARDEN CLUB

The October meeting of the Garden Group was organised for the salubrious surroundings of Government House overlooking the wonderful Darwin Harbour. Due to the venue several of our friends from other Probus clubs joined us to share the joy.

Head gardener, Dermot, led the charge along the shaded walkway of the Western Terrace and the sloping pathway of the Eastern Terrace, ably assisted by his offsides David, charged with the responsibility of ensuring no old legs were left behind.

Dermot gave interesting snippets of developmental history and showed a few dated photographs, including a 100 year old photo of the large banyan tree, now estimated to be about 130 years old.

Dermot has been on the gardening team for about 30 years, most of it as head gardener and the development during that period is simply breathtaking. What was overgrown land overshadowed by large invasive trees is now beautifully shaded gardens stocked with thousands of ground covering and low growing plants. A special item of interest was a row of Chinese origin cycads about 7 years old with spreading feathery-leafed fronds, not at all what we envision when we think of cycads.

After a wonderful tour we were then able to adjourn to the residence to be welcomed by His Honour and partake of morning tea. A good morning.

GOTHENBURG- NOT JUST A ROAD - sent in by Ron Wright

We are all familiar with Gothenburg Crescent in Stuart Park but probably only half of us know of the significance and history.

Darwin-February 1875

Magistrate Edward William Price placed his wife Minna and children aboard the steamship Gothenburg at Darwin wharf for them to sail to Adelaide to arrange education for their children (5 children according to Northern Territory Dictionary Biography, 6 according to the passenger manifest, 5 according to the family tree)

On 24 February, wet season, no GPS, no weather forecasts, the Gothenburg ran aground on the Great Barrier Reef near Bowen and sank with 22 survivors in lifeboats and between 98 and 122 people drowning (poor record keeping), the whole of the Price family being in the latter group.

How long before the news got back to Darwin? How long before Edward knew he was a widower and childless? What would this do to the mental state of a devoted husband and father?

Nevertheless, life choices needed to be made, Edward remained in Darwin and was installed as the 4th Government Resident (Administrator) in Darwin for the South Australian government from 1876 to 1883.

Credited with being the instigator of the Darwin to Pine Creek railway, reconstruction of the termite damaged sections of Government House, establishment of nurseries, trials of sugarcane and coffee, observing the arrival of the first cattle to the NT and a myriad of other developments in rural and remote areas, he eventually left in a poor state of health, ironically on the SS Bowen. Such was his regard in the Chinese Community that it organised a parade for him beginning at Sue Wah Loong's store.



Travelling to Adelaide?- Stuart Highway, bitumen all the way, check in with the family each evening using satellite technology.

A bit more leisurely? Try a cruise ship, GPS navigation, weather reports and communication all available through satellite technology.

In a hurry? Travel 3.5 hours by air, satellites again an enabler.

Darwin a bit hot? The air conditioning at Tracy Village might even be a bit chilly as Edward's great grandniece sits quietly knitting through a Darwin Probus Club meeting, a link of 150 years with the Territory.

How things have changed over that 150 years.
